Hello Everyone,

I hope this note finds you well. This month I return to focusing on our hospital kids, and I hope you enjoy

reading their stories. This month's focus is on Annabel. The following information is readily available on Shriners Children's website, but I am more than happy to bring it to you personally.

Annabel is a 17-year-old Shriners Children's Philadelphia patient with a special new tie to the hospital.

She was referred by a New Jersey upper extremity physician, who realized that the specialized surgery she needed should be performed by Dan Zlotolow, M.D., at Shriners Children's Philadelphia. Annabel is a gymnast and unfortunately suffered an osteochondritis dissecans lesion in her left elbow that required an osteochondral autograft transfer system procedure on her left knee and elbow. Dr. Zlotolow performed the surgery, and it was successful. He said, "Annabel had the equivalent of a 'pothole' in her elbow joint. We used a camera to look inside the joint, and then filled in the hole with a plug of cartilage from the knee. She worked really hard to get back her motion and strength so she could return to gymnastics."

Annabel shared a special experience she had while at the hospital for a follow-up visit: "A couple months after my surgery, Dr. Zlotolow brought me into another patient's room, also a gymnast, and about a month behind me in recovery from the same surgery I had. It was a really meaningful experience for me to be able to speak with someone who I could relate to, and I hoped I helped her look forward to when she was recovered."

Each and every member of the staff truly cares about the patients.

Annabel's medical journey combined with her interest in science led her to delve deeper into her passion. Annabel saw information about the 2025 Summer Research Immersion Program at Shriners Children's Philadelphia and filled out an application to participate. She was selected and was excited to partake in the combination of professional medical lectures, hands-on labs, research projects and shadowing of medical professionals. This was especially enriching for Annabel, as it marked her first step to pursuing a career in medicine.

For fun, Annabel enjoys participating in gymnastics, both with a club team and her high school team. She was able to return to the sport she loves as a result of the successful surgery at our hospital. She is also a part of her town's EMS squad, and is even pursuing her EMT certification this summer. She plays the viola in her high school orchestra, which was another reason she was grateful to have the surgery on her elbow, as she needs proper extension to play. In addition, she is a peer minister at her church, and she volunteers her time at a summer camp for children with cancer and blood disorders. Annabel is a model student who excels in a variety of activities, and she is an inspiration to others to persevere through setbacks. Annabel said of Shriners Children's Philadelphia, "...each and every member of the staff truly cares about the patients. Shriners' mission is so special in the way it prioritizes not only patient health, but happiness and confidence as well. This organization's focus on children and its work to make care accessible and affordable for all is so important. The hospital develops innovative and ground-breaking surgeries that make true differences in kids' lives - like mine." Annabel is a new Patient Ambassador, and

Notes from the Oasis Treasurer's Desk

As year-end approaches, I would like to take a minute and thank everyone for all they have done this past year to help make it a successful year. While none of us are perfect, we do strive to do the best we can, improve where we can, and move forward always mindful of our joint efforts to serve the children that need our help.

By now, clubs and units have elected their officers for 2026 and are steadily preparing for the changing of the guard that rolls around each year. In preparation of that change, a few housekeeping things to remember.

First, review and update your signature cards and information at the bank. Clubs must have at least 2 accounts, one for operational transactions ("fraternal account") and one for the hospital for all the hospital related transactions ("charitable account"). Please remember that you cannot, under any circumstance, co-mingle these funds.

Second, go ahead now and appoint the audit committee that will be responsible for reviewing and approving the annual financial report.

Third, have the current treasurer and the new treasurer start putting together the information needed for the annual report, this will make the transition much easier.

I have received a few questions during this past year about the purpose and requirements of the annual financial report. The information contained in those reports must be included in the tax returns that Oasis files each year with the IRS. This required IRS filing and the requirement for Oasis to provide information to Shriners' International is why it is imperative that we have all the financial reports at Oasis BEFORE February 1 of each year.

If you prefer, this form is also available as an excel spreadsheet from the Shriners International website in the member portal (login required).

We will, again this year, be going over this at the Annual Club and Unit Officer Orientation training and update session coming up on January 31, 2026 and will be available to help with reviewing and assisting in completing these forms. Don't forget to bring your bank statement copies from December with you along with the other information.

Lady Jo Anne and I have enjoyed the opportunity to meet and work with many more members of the Shriner family and wish each of you a fun filled Thanksgiving and a very Merry Christmas.


Nobles Farris and Sigmon Receive 2025 Walt Disney Awards

Petals of Hope: Shrine Patient Monthly Story

Lydia's Story: The Final Petal of Hope, Where Resilience Blossoms and Hope Endures

As the seasons shift and the petals begin to settle, I find myself writing this final Petals of Hope story with a heart full of gratitude and reflection. Over the course of this year, we've witnessed extraordinary young lives blossom in the face of profound challenges — each story a symbol of resilience, grace, and the beauty of what can grow from uncertainty.

It feels only fitting to close this chapter with the story of Lydia — a little girl whose journey, much like the gentle bloom of the dogwood tree, reminds us that strength can be delicate, determined, and deeply rooted. The dogwood, known for thriving through cold and storm, has long symbolized endurance and rebirth. And Lydia, with her radiant smile and unyielding spirit, is

a living expression of that symbolism — proof that even when beginnings are marked by fear, hope can still flower.

Thank you for allowing me to share these stories. As this final Petal of Hope gently falls, Lydia's story reminds us that even in moments of uncertainty, strength, joy, and fierce determination can bloom. Through every step of her journey, the compassionate care of Shriners Children's has nurtured not only her growth, but the unwavering hope of her family.

May Lydia's journey, and all those who came before her, continue to inspire the kind of compassion, courage, and community that helps children bloom, no matter what they face. Because of Shriners, thousands of children like Lydia are not only finding healing, but also discovering the beautiful strength within themselves.



"It was a pretty devastating moment."

During a scan 20 weeks into her pregnancy, parents Amanda and Dan were given news that left them frightened and overwhelmed. Their first child, a little girl to be named Lydia, was missing the radial bone in her left arm, and the development of the bones in her appending hand were an uncertainty.

"I wish more doctors knew to tell people to go [to Shriners Children's] when they are given news like this," Amanda said. "You feel so alone, and it seems no one can tell you what's going on. But we were lucky that we had already heard about Shriners Children's from a friend."

Still unaware that the pediatric orthopedic hospital actually had a program specifically designed for parents just like them, Amanda called; she hoped for the opportunity to be able to ask a specialist at the hospital about Lydia's condition prior to her arrival.

"We were scheduled for an outpatient clinic appointment with one of the surgeons," she said. Amanda, who was still

processing the news, was relieved that the Prenatal Education meeting immediately left Dan feeling much better - a feeling she would also gain soon. "There were so many 'what-ifs' that we couldn't know yet, but now we were more informed. We knew we would get the support we needed, and we were grateful that Shriners Children's was close to home."

Additionally, Amanda says the information and knowledge provided to the couple in the Prenatal Education meeting gave them the power to better advocate for Lydia.

Diagnosed with radial dysplasia, Lydia returned with her parents to the hospital soon after she was born. An early intervention care plan was created, giving Lydia a head start at a chance for the best long-term results. A visit to the Prosthetic and Orthotic Services Department (POPS) gave Lydia a custom brace created to fit her specific needs. As she grows and her needs change, so will her brace.

"Even as tiny infant, she was so happy and smiley. Now she is very curious, and she loves to laugh - she makes us laugh every day. She is fierce, and has been resilient throughout her life."

The mission of the care team at Shriners Children's means they will be able to continue to provide life changing care for the now-toddler through childhood, adolescence and her teen years.

We can be resentful, or we can do those things that honor our loved one. Things such as planting a memorial garden. Things such as establishing a scholarship fund. Good positive things that will be our loved one's legacy. And, who is in charge of our loved one's legacy? Yes—YOU and I are in charge!

WE—you and I are in charge of how our loved one will be remembered! What will we do now? None of us are immune from great losses and tragedies.

Grief is NOT a sign of weakness, nor is grief a lack of faith. Some people have the mistaken idea that a person with a strong faith does **not** grieve...because he or she is above mourning or one's faith in God replaces one's pain of loss. Nope!

Nowhere in the scripture do we find God calling us to be without passion, no scripture tells us to show no joy, and no scripture tells us to show no sorrow in our lives. We have very good examples of how we are to grieve. The shortest sentence in the Bible: "Jesus Wept." Jesus wept when his friend Lazarus died. Our faith encourages us to grieve in healthy ways.

How does someone face the death of a loved one, pick up the pieces and go on with their lives? That is a question that we struggle with. When we are walking that road through the valley of the shadow, many of us don't like the way we feel.

Our hearts are broken and we want God to take our painful grief away—and right now, too. But, we have assurances from the word of our Lord that if we **wait,** in His own time, he will renew us. We hope you will find new, renewed hope as you go on with your life, especially in this Holiday Season. Blessings!






