From the Recorder



Hello Everyone,

I hope this note finds you well. My next few articles will focus on our hospital kids, and I hope you enjoy reading their

stories. This month's focus is on Ezra. The following information is readily available on Shriners Children's website, but I am more than happy to bring it to you personally.

Scoliosis Can't Stop the Music

Specialized, family-centered care at Shriners Children's allowed Ezra, 18, to receive life-changing scoliosis treatment while pursuing his musical passion.

Ezra is a talented teen violinist who has played for 12 years and has spent the past three performing with a suburban Chicago youth orchestra. In 2024 he was excited to join the orchestra's prestigious honor ensembles in the Hanson String Quartet. But the serious effects of a lifelong and worsening health condition put performance and his health at risk. "After I was accepted into Youth Symphony, I faced one of my biggest challenges, but it didn't pertain to music," Ezra wrote. Thanks to advanced scoliosis treatment from Shriners Children's pediatric spine team--and some creativity--he stayed on track musically and is now playing with a much straighter spine and less pain.

Ezra was born with several complex medical conditions, including congenital scoliosis. In 2014, his family turned to the pediatric orthopedic spine program at Shriners Children's Chicago for care. As he grew taller, the curve in his spine also grew. But it was more than his curve that caused concern. Ezra's vertebrae were abnormally shaped, including butterfly vertebrae, hemi (wedgeshaped), and block (fused) vertebrae. In Dr. Gupta's words, "Ezra has an alphabet soup of abnormalities with his spine."

Eventually, his unusual spine was shaped in an 'S' curve of more than 100 degrees. Surgery was scheduled for fall of 2024. His orthopedic spine surgeon put Ezra in 24/7 inpatient halo traction for one month prior to surgery. Halo-gravity traction is a treatment for scoliosis and other spine deformities that involves gently stretching and straightening the spine. The treatment involves attaching a metal ring, called a halo, around the head and connecting it to a weighted pulley system.

"This technique has been around for quite a while, but a lot of medical facilities stopped offering it years ago because of the challenges involved with the length of time children needed to be 'in halo,' as we call it, and insurance wouldn't always cover that cost," Dr. Szczodry said.

Ezra was concerned that all those weeks away from the symphony while in halo might mean losing his spot in the ensemble he'd worked so hard to reach. To keep in practice, his music director suggested a new idea. What if Ezra and his quartet could hold weekly rehearsals at Shriners Children's? The request was approved by the inpatient and spine care team, giving the quartet special access to the hospital's Teen Lounge, which provided a small private space to rehearse.

Shriners Children's Chicago is one of only a handful of facilities in the country that offers halo treatment and allows children to stay in the hospital throughout the entire multi-week treatment process. After halo traction, children usually have spinal fusion surgery to permanently straighten the spine. Dr. Szczodry said the halo-first approach reduces intraoperative risk of damaging the spinal cord and nerves, as well as soft tissues that surround and support the spine.

"I have witnessed incredible transformations with halo traction," said Dr. Szczodry. "Kids who arrive with severe,

stuck-out spinal curves see their spines gradually straighten and actually feel it straightening in the process. Although the setup can look uncomfortable, our patients typically like the feeling of being stretched and the feeling that comes with it. This treatment is part of our lifechanging care for many of our kids and allows them to get back to doing the things they love sooner."

Ezra just remembers those pins. "While halo traction was for the most part painless for me, I did learn that if I didn't thoroughly clean my halo pins every day, they would become very irritated. The hardest part about halo traction is getting used to sleeping with six pins sticking out of your head," said Ezra. With his halo in place, his inpatient stay began. Ezra recalls telling his mom during the second week as an inpatient, "I love it here!" During his stay, he performed the Star-Spangled Banner at a Paralympic Games opening-day celebration for patients. "Thanks to the willingness of the Hansen String Quartet

members to drive all the way into Chicago, I was able to rehearse while in traction," said Ezra. After successful halo treatment, Ezra underwent posterior spinal fusion surgery on September 25, 2024, to address his 120-degree curve between T1 and L4.

"I am feeling great after surgery, although my first three weeks after were quite painful. The process of getting my nerves acclimated and reset was the biggest hurdle," he said. "It's been half a year since spinal fusion and my life is pretty much the same with the exception of no BLT (bending, lifting or twisting). Six weeks after surgery, I was able to return to playing my violin, which in my opinion helped me recover faster and regain feeling in my back and left arm. Now I am back playing gigs and recitals."

Things continue to go well here at Oasis, and we would love to have your stop by and visit <u>your</u> temple. Take care until next month, and remember, the work you do for our fraternity and philanthropy is sincerely appreciated and essential to our hospitals and all our Shriners Children's programs like Ezra's, that they serve.



Petals of Hope: Lady Laura's Monthly Story

Just as the dogwood bloom symbolizes endurance, rebirth, and quiet strength, Olivia's story unfolds as a living example of grace through adversity. Diagnosed with bilateral clubfoot before she was even born, Olivia's journey could have been marked by limitations—but thanks to early intervention and the expert care of Shriners Children's Greenville, it became one of triumph and transformation.

From her first casting at just two weeks old to multiple surgeries

and years of bracing, Olivia met each challenge with the quiet resilience that echoes the spirit of the dogwood—delicate in appearance, yet deeply rooted in strength. Now 14, she is thriving: marching with her school band, playing soccer, and inspiring others as a Shriners patient ambassador.

This month in **Petals of Hope**, Olivia reminds us that healing is not just about medicine—it's about possibility, purpose, and the people who help us bloom into our fullest selves.



From the moment she was born, Olivia's journey was one of resilience and determination. Diagnosed with bilateral clubfoot while still in utero, her feet appeared twisted inward at the ankle, a condition that could have left her unable to walk if left untreated.

Erin, Olivia's mom, was initially terrified by the

unknown diagnosis. However, that fear turned into hope after she attended a Prenatal Education Program session at Shriners Children's Greenville. Touring the facility and speaking with Olivia's future medical staff about advanced treatment options and available services quieted Erin's worries.

"They gave me the reassurance I needed," said Erin. "Before she was even born, I knew Shriners Children's would help provide her the best life."

At two weeks old, Olivia began treatment with casting using the Ponseti method, a process of gradually moving her feet to the correct position. This was the beginning of Olivia's remarkable

journey toward healing. Over the next few years, Olivia underwent several weeks of casting, four years of bracing, and seven surgeries.

Today, at 14, Olivia is a vibrant girl with a world of possibilities ahead of her. She walks and runs freely, something that once seemed impossible. "Because of the treatment I received, I get the life I deserve," Olivia says with gratitude.

Olivia's life is full and active. She plays the clarinet and percussion in her high school marching band, participating in various parades and half-time shows, and enjoys playing soccer. She is also an avid fundraiser and loyal patient ambassador for Shriners Children's Greenville, sharing her story and spreading awareness about "the most amazing care" she has received, while raising funds to benefit other patients. "Shriners Children's gave me the biggest gift of my life, and I am so thankful to them for that," she says.

Inspired by the physical therapists who have helped her, Olivia dreams of becoming a physical therapist herself. She plans to pursue this dream after high school, driven by a desire to give other children the same chance at a full and active life that she has been given.


Oasis Presents Two 50 Year Shrine Service Awards at Spring Ceremonial












This Hobo caught by the Oasis Railroad Police is "Ted E," named Clown Shriner of the Year.

- Upon return home from Fall SASA, Oasis will provide a reimbursement check to each Unit for \$25 for each Unit member who participated in the parade.

INFORMATION FROM SASA REGARDING REGISTRATION FOR 2025 FALL SASA IN MYRTLE BEACH

As our 2025 Fall SASA convention is approaching fast, the Credentials Committee would like to highlight the following:

- Pre-registration will open on Tuesday, July 1st and will close at the end of business on September 16th, which is the Tuesday before the festival. We believe that this should give everyone the opportunity to pre-register through the registration portal which will be located on the SASA website link that will be opened and shared at a later date. - Late registration will open in the Exhibit Hall on Thursday, September 18th. Please reference the registration schedule according to SASA schedule for hours.

A Late Fee of \$40 will be charged for those that register after the closing of the pre-registration portal on September 16th.

 We anticipate having approximately 2,700 Nobles and Ladies that will register for this event. The cost will be \$25 per Noble; your ladies and guests are free. Tickets to the various events can be added to the registration cost when completing your registration.

It is important that we capture online all those who plan to attend this festival as we are eligible for monies from the City of Myrtle Beach and the Chamber of Commerce based on those numbers which will help offset the cost of the festival. Please indicate on your registration the total number of people in your party and also indicate if you are a SASA representative, otherwise you will not be allowed to vote.

We ask that you encourage pre-registration with the nobility in your Temples as this will significantly speed up the process of registration upon arrival. This also will eliminate the need to pay the Late Fee as noted above. We have (5) volunteers who have graciously agreed to run the registration for us, and the process takes additional time to complete when registering on arrival instead of online especially when the line is long. Please note that your event tickets will be noted on your registration identification card that you receive at checkin and must be with you at all events in order to enter.

As there are a limited number of event tickets available, we encourage you to pre-register on the portal and include any of those events you wish to attend. Should the events not sell out, events can be added at the registration desk upon arrival which will require a **change** in your identification badge when picked up.

For your Nobles who have concerns or are not computer savvy, we encourage you, your Units, Clubs or Temple offices, to assist them in registering online for the event.
