





A Story of Brotherly Love in Action

The Oasis Band was set to travel to Aberdeen/ Southern Pines, eagerly anticipating the Oasis Ceremonial on November 2 at Roman Eagle Lodge No. 550. However, fate intervened as, unknown to us, one of the wheels on our band trailer had developed a slow leak. Our intrepid Captain, Noble Hans Haas, arriving early to pick up the truck and trailer, noticed the flat tire and drove the rig to a local tire store, hoping for a guick repair. Not to be; the problem was diagnosed, not as a tire issue, but as a pin hole leak in the rim itself. The dilemma: could the rig make it to Aberdeen, about a 2-1/2 hour trip? Decision made, Captain Hans managed to nurse the trailer to Aberdeen, stopping to add air to the tire every 20-30 minutes.

Having successfully reached the site of the Ceremonial, our Captain joined the Band for the opening musical set. At the break, the pressing issue became how to re-inflate the now flat tire. Captain Hans pled his case to the Nobles in attendance for assistance. Nobles from the Director's Staff and the Sand T's sprang into action. Magically, everything seemed to happen at once. One Noble appeared with a portable






compressor, followed by the Aberdeen Fire Chief, Phillip Richardson (a member of the Sand T's) who called in his troops. A squad truck and a rescue truck showed up with a new rim and tire and the Director's Staff Nobles assisted with changing out the tire.

A huge thanks and shout out to all the Nobles and especially the members of the Aberdeen Fire Department that helped us! Among those we are grateful for:

Phillip Richardson - Chief of the Aberdeen Fire Department, Past Master (x2) of Roman Eagle Lodge #550, member of the Oasis Sand T's. Phillip orchestrated the complete trailer rescue after the Director's Assistants attempted to inflate the flat tire and deemed the wheel a total loss. Their small compressor simply could not keep up with the leak that appeared to worsen as we watched.

Mark Galyean - Volunteer Safety Officer for Aberdeen Fire and Rescue. Brought his personal truck loaded with a heavy-duty garage jack, lug wrench, tools, and everything but the kitchen sink (maybe that too).

Desperado McCrimmon - Fire Fighter for Aberdeen FD. Brought Aberdeen Fire & Rescue Squad 111 and the donated tire mounted to rim from the fire house.

on the Squad and he
completed the task with
a roll of duct tape.

David Wooten - Oasis Director Staff's 1st Lieutenant - Supplied compressor and labor when trying to inflate original tire and rim. Provided a link for a future purchase of a compressor for the band rig. Assisted with changing the tire and rim.

Hunter Fulbright - Oasis Temple Director's Assistant - Supplied compressor and labor when trying to inflate the original tire and rim. Provided most of the labor to remove and replace the wheel on trailer.

In the end, the Band was able to successfully participate in the afternoon parade. An amazing sight to see all the Nobles working together to solve a problem. What a testimony to Masonic Brotherhood!
