Imperial. All Oasis approved fundraisers **MUST** have their finial accounting report submitted to Oasis Accounting Office no later than 30 days following the event. A final report is due by Oasis to International by 30 days.

Third Parties can work directly with the great team at Shriners Children's Greenville and Shriners International. Third Party Fundraiser Request Forms are available on the Oasis website. When use of the hospital logo or name is used all monies must be given to the hospital. A true and proper accounting also must be completed immediately following the event. If you learn of any fundraiser that is saying Shriners Hospitals for Children (SHC) or now Shrines children's (SC) please make sure it is approved."

Please follow the rules, as these are set by Shriners International and are for the betterment of all involved.





"We are uniquely positioned to help these children from Ukraine, because our physicians, nurses and therapists have extensive experience in providing care for children who suffer life-threatening burn injuries, including in natural disaster or other urgent situations. Our team members are using the most current research-based treatments in pediatric burn care."

Shriners Children's stands ready to care for more children from the region who can benefit from our specialized care. In the last decade, we have established medical "go teams" from our hospitals to be available any time there is a disaster or need for emergency care for children.

Shriners Children's care is sought out throughout the world for complex pediatric burns cases, because our physicians and care teams have contributed to most of the significant advancements in acute and reconstructive pediatric burn care. We provide comprehensive multidisciplinary care to children with burn injuries and cutaneous conditions anywhere in the world.






