


REMINDER – No one person can hold the office of secretary and treasurer. The duties must be separated, and office held by different persons. If you have done this, it <u>must</u> be changed. One person--one office. If you need any assistance or have any questions, please feel free to contact me or the office.

This month's spotlight on Oasis Divan leadership takes us to the top of the boardroom table where you will find the elected offices of Potentate and Recorder. This month spotlight is on the elected position of Oasis Potentate. The 2022 position is currently held by Illustrious Sir Tim Daniels and will end December 31.
