Your Recorder

Hello Nobles, Ladies, and friends of the Shrine.

My items this month will pertain to the upcoming Imperial Session to be held in Charlotte, NC, July 2-July 6. The following items will be voted upon at the session:

- For the "roll call," the presiding officer can call for a physical roll call, or an electronic roll call.
- For smaller temples (*less than 300 members*)the number of allowed representatives would increase from one (1) to two (2)
- In the event of a national emergency in the nonhost country, representatives would be allowed to attend via video-conference.
- Shriners International per capital tax (dues that are fraternally collected as part of our annual dues) would increase from \$30/year to \$60/year. There will be a great deal of discussion on this one, I predict!!!!
- Masonic Lodge Status—a Shrine temple could accept a petition from a Mason (*currently one must be a Master Mason*) for the petition to be accepted.

- Shriners International would annually be allowed to furnish Shrine Associations with the names, addresses, and email of Nobles within the jurisdiction of that Association's temples. (This has been brought forward in the past and rejected. This time may be different, who knows?)
- Several items involving temple jurisdictions, change of temple address, etc. (this is the boring part of the session. ^(□))
- Request to form a new temple from the state of Santa Catarina in the country of Brazil.
- Request to form a new temple from Lubnan Shriners, U.D., in the Republic of Lebanon.

Wow, wasn't that exciting!!!!! O.K., that's probably enough for this edge-of-your-seat learning session. Wow, the time does fly. Oasis Shriners Potentate's Lineage

Greetings again from the Oasis Historical Preservation Society. This month we will showcase the Potentate's lineage of Past Potentate IS Ken Jarrett. IS Kenneth Dewayne Jarrett currently lives in Newton, NC and is Mr. Mac Tools in western North Carolina. His lineage begins just like IS Bill Carter's line with IS Arthur J. Crampton, IS Dr. Richard Jordan Noble, IS Louis Duncanson Sutherland and IS Lee Alphonso Folger. IS Folger made two appointments to the moving line in 1929 due to Noble Thomas J. Harkins leaving the line. The following table lists the IS Ken Jarrett line in its entirety.

IS Claude Allen Cochran was born in Star, NC on January 27, 1884. He attended the UNC School of Law from 1902-1904. He practiced law in Charlotte and became a City Attorney there. He entered the Army in 1917 and obtained the rank of Captain in 1919 while with the 321st Regiment at Camp Jackson. Novice Claude A. Cochran elected to membership in 1917 and was created a Noble of the Mystic Shrine for Oasis by Omar Temple, while he was stationed at Camp Jackson. He is listed as a veteran Patrolman. IS Cochran was Potentate when the first issue of the Desert Dust was published, June 1935.

IS Harold Finley Coffey was born March 6, 1898 in Junction City, Kansas. He was a student at Davidson University from 1916-1917. In 1917 he joined the Kent-Coffey Manufacturing Company in Lenior, NC, which was started by his father Finley H. Coffey and Dr. A.A. Kent in 1907 and began his storied career as an American furniture manufacturing company executive. He was a recipient of the Outstanding Service Award, Free Enterprise Awards Association, 1962, a Meritorious Achievement Award from the National Conference Christians and Jews in 1964 and named Man of the Year American Furniture Mart in 1964. He served on the Board of Governors American Furniture Mart, Chicago, chairman, 1942-1943. He also served on the Board of Governors Dallas Trade Mart and the Advisory Board New York Furniture Exchange. Harold F. Coffey has been listed as a noteworthy furniture manufacturing company executive by Marquis Who's Who. Novice Coffey was created a Noble on December 3, 1919. He was appointed to the Divan in 1935 and was Potentate in 1942.



IS Frank Odell Sherrill was born in Madison, NC in 1894. Novice Frank Odell Sherrill was created a Noble on May 20, 1921 in Asheville, NC. IS Sherrill is known for S & W Cafeteria, which was organized in 1920 by himself and Fred Weber, who had served as mess sergeants together in World War 1. The operation originated at Ivey's Department store which was in Charlotte. The initial restaurant was located at 100 W. Trade Street in downtown Charlotte, as shown in this photograph.

IS Clarence Earl Beeson was a native of Winston-Salem, NC. At the age of 7 his family moved to North Wilkesboro where he remained until moving to Charlotte. Upon high school graduation, IS Beeson started his own re-capping company and operated it successfully for some time. Realizing that college training would be a great advantage to him in his business career, he sold his re-capping business and took an intensive business course at Evans Business College and joined Southern Bearings & Parts Company soon after graduation. In March 1927, IS Beeson purchased an interest in the company, and in November of 1947 was elected President and General Manager. Captain Beeson was Captain of the Oasis Patrol

from 1944 thru 1946. He was active in the Shrine Bowl game from its inception in 1937. He served as General Chairman of the game in 1944-45 and was instrumental in organizing the Board of Governors of the Shrine Bowl Game of the Carolinas, Inc., and was the first Chairman of the Board. It was his idea that the Shrine Bowl Game sell Patron tickets. Novice Beeson was created a Noble on September 20, 1929.

IS Ralph Odell Hood was born in Charlotte, NC on April 27, 1905. He attended local schools and signed up for the Navy at the age of 17. He became involved in the Navy athletic program and became quite proficient in boxing. As a pro he boxed on the Atlantic Seaboard from Maryland to Florida and was very successful. In 1926 he took a job as a fireman on the steam locomotive Seaboard, which was backbreaking work but kept him in shape for boxing. In 1930 he opened a filling station, and at the time of his appointment to the moving line in 1956, was Texaco's oldest distributor in points of service, handling the same product. Novice Hood was created a Noble in January 1941. He immediately joined the Drum & Bugle Corps and served there until he was appointed to the Director's Staff. He was appointed Director in 1953 by IS Claude Babington Squires and served in that capacity until his appointment to the moving line by IS Clarence Earl Beeson.

IS William Edward Burrier was born in Baltimore, Maryland on August 12, 1905. He was educated in the Baltimore City Schools and Baltimore City College and later attended Johns Hopkins University. He started his first and only job on a part-time basis with the New Amsterdam-United States Casualty Insurance Company, which developed into a full-time position. In 1938, he moved to Charlotte as the Assistant to the Southern Manager specializing in Surety Bonds. His knowledge and experience in this specialized field of insurance led him to share his knowledge by teaching for 10 summers in the extension division of the University of North Carolina and in Charlotte. In 1937, he was created a Noble in Almas Shrine Temple in

Washington DC. The 1960's were quite busy masonically for IS Burrier. In May 1961, he resigned his position as an executive of the Southern Division of the United States Casualty Company to assume the position of Secretary of the Carolina Consistory, for the Charlotte Scottish Rite Bodies. He was then elected to the office of the Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Ancient, Free and Accepted Masons of North Carolina in 1963, having been appointed as Grand Steward by then GM James Guy Johnston in 1958. Also in 1963, he was appointed Outer Guard of Oasis by IS Ralph Odell Hood, serving as Potentate in 1970.

IS Karl Caldwell "Bill" Miller was born in Huntersville, NC on January 23, 1909. IS Miller was Secretary and Treasurer of Miller & Kerns Funeral Directors. He served as President of the North Carolina State Funeral Directors Association in 1958. He was also a member of the Board of North Carolina State Embalmers and Funeral Directors Examining Board. Novice Miller was created a Noble of Oasis Shriners on October 31, 1953. He served as Vice Chairman of the Shrine Bowl Game in 1956 and as General Chairman of the Shrine Bowl Game in 1957 and 1958. He served as the President of the Shrine Bowl Board of Governors in 1961 and 1962, and at the time of his appointment to the moving line in 1970, he was serving as Secretary of Shrine Bowl Board of Governors. IS Miller served as Potentate in 1978.

IS Marvin Eugene "Gene" Morrison was born on January 7, 1933. IS Morrison is retired as owner of electrical contractor Interstate Electric Company, a company which was started in 1932 by his father, Ernest A. "Ernie" Morrison, Sr. IS Morrison's brother, Noble Ernest Morrison, Jr., served with him on the Oasis Divan as Director in the early 1980's. IS Morrison was Paper Sale Chairman in 1977. He has served SASA as Secretary/Treasurer and was the President of SASA for 1999-2000. IS Morrison is a Past Captain of the Drum & Bugle Corps and is a Past Director of ROJ, Charlotte Court 109. IS Morrison made a change to the Divan his year as Potentate (1986) by adding the office of Marshall to the moving line, making it a ten (10) year line. He made two appointments to the line that year, Noble John T. "Tom" Price and Noble James H. Richardson, Sr. The Marshall continued to be a moving position until 2008. In 2009, the moving line was shortened to seven (7) years by removing the offices of Marshall, Captain of the Guard and Outer Guard.

IS James H. Richardson, Sr., "The Mountain Man", was born on May 20, 1935, and was created an Oasis Noble on January 22, 1966 at Oasis Temple in Charlotte. IS Richardson is retired as President of J & M Richardson Corporation, which operated a nursing home in Wilkesboro, North Carolina and was involved with owning another nursing home along with a group of local doctors. IS Richardson is a Charter Member and Past President of Blue Ridge Shrine Club in Wilkesboro. IS Richardson had the distinct honor of being the Oasis Potentate in 1995, our 100th Anniversary year. Shrinefest '95, which commemorated 100 years of Shrine in the Carolinas, was held on September 8th and 9th. A kick-off Parade began at noon on September 8th in downtown Charlotte. The rest of the events were held at Oasis Shrine Headquarters and included a BBQ Cookoff sponsored by Memphis in May, a main stage of musical groups, a kid's stage, carnival games, an auto show and hot air balloon rides.

IS Paul L. Hagerty, Jr., was born on January 12, 1950, and was created an Oasis Noble on August 21, 1982. IS Hagerty is retired as owner of Wes-Co Enterprises in Granite Falls, NC, which is a leading provider of shipping and packaging solutions to customers in the southeast US and around the world. After joining Oasis, IS Hagerty has been very active as a member of the Director's Staff and Foothills Shrine Club and is also a member of Catawba County Shrine Club and Greensboro Shrine Club. IS Hagerty has served on the Hospital Board in Cincinnati, which is now Shriners Children's Ohio located in Dayton.

IS Fred Laxton is self-employed as the owner of Piedmont Corrugated for 18 years. His company, which has been in existence for more than 50 years, produces boxes and trays for various industries, predominantly furniture. He has been a Certified Public Accountant since 1998. Illustrious Sir Fred served as President of Catawba County Shrine Club and as an Oasis Tipster. His Shrine journey was heavily influenced by his father who he lovingly calls "a Shriner's Shriner." He is most proud of his wife, Lady Rhonda, and their two children, Holland and Warner, as he recalls during his year of service as Potentate in 2013, the "Holland's Hope" campaign raised about \$130,000 which provided specialized medical equipment for Shriner's Childrens Greenville.

Illustrious Sir Kenneth "Kenny" Jarrett became a Master Mason in 1993 and joined Oasis Shriners in 2000. At age 16 when he married Lady Vickie, Illustrious Ken worked as a diesel mechanic for five years before deciding to becoming a coast-to-coast big rig driver hauling produce for the next 10 years. During that time, he served on the Interstate Trucking Association (ITA) board and was featured on the cover of Overdrive Magazine in October 1989. An opportunity then became available at Mac Tools where he will celebrate 33 years with the company this July 17. Illustrious Sir Kenny co-founded the Oasis Gator Patrol and served as its Charter Captain in 2005. He is also a Past President of the Catawba County Shrine Club. He is a life member of Plateau Methodist Church in Vale where he has served as a member of the Board of Trustees and as its chairman. He is most proud of his greatest accomplishment, the loves of his life, Ladies Vickie, Angie, Reva, Harley, and Sophie.



Just 13 miles from the convention center, you'll find Carowinds amusement park, with nearly 60 world-class rides, including fourteen roller coasters with thrill levels ranging from kiddie to crazy. There is also Camp Snoopy, which is filled with rides for the little ones. The park's Carolina Harbor claims its place as the best waterpark in the Carolinas, with everything from Blackbeard's Revenge to Kiddy Hawk Cove. Visit carowinds.com.

For those interested in an inspirational experience, visit the Billy Graham Library. This museum and library documents and commemorates the life and ministry of Billy Graham. It looks like a barn, reminiscent of the farm where Graham was raised. The exhibit even has an animated, talking cow to welcome visitors, and profiles Graham, his wife, his ministry and his impact. Graham and his wife are buried in the prayer garden

If you and your family are looking for adventure and an adrenaline blast, head to the U.S. National Whitewater Center, about 16 miles from the convention center. Here you can raft the world's largest manmade whitewater river, testing rapids from class II to IV with a professional guide. Decide between family rafting, adventure rafting, "big water" sessions (where the water flow is twice as much and twice as intense), or even "rodeo rafting" on a smaller raft. You can also try ziplines, rope courses, climbing, flat-water kayaking, yoga and more. Visit center. whitewater.org for a preview.

Charlotte Convention Center Imperial Session will take place in the convention center, located in the middle of everything! The public opening, pageant, marketing and communications report, All Nobility Evening and business sessions will be held in the 40,000 square-foot Crown Ballroom. Get ready for the 80's Flashback Weekend



A life free of fear: 30-day challenge

"Those who plot evil go astray. But, those who plan what is good find love and faithfulness" - Proverbs 14

For the last two years we have been living in much uncertainty, in fact some of us are living in fear! We fear getting sick, we fear running out of money and we fear for our loved ones. In these strange times the question becomes: "HOW CAN WE LIVE A LIFE FREE OF FEAR?"

Well, the Book of Proverbs in the Bible provides

us a constant reminder of God's love for us, profound insights and exceptional wisdom on how to live a joyful and peaceful life. John Maxwell is a popular speaker, author and pastor who has written over fifty books. A year or so ago he challenged an audience with the same challenge I pass on to you. Here it is:

The challenge is to take about two or three minutes each day and read a chapter of the Book of Proverbs. "A chapter a day!" you might say. Yes. The chapters in the Book of Proverbs are really short chapters, and Maxwell promises that it will take only two or three minutes a day to read an entire chapter. And, guess what else? 


