

The Nobles and Ladies of the Surry County Mini Truckers, Surry Shrine Club, and Elkin Jonesville Shrine Club have come together to help us be able to make memories that should last for years.

If you have time to get away, please plan to visit Mount Airy on Wednesday or Thursday before the ceremony. There are so many beautiful places to visit. Pilot Mountain is a great place to begin your experience. There are several local stores where you can visit to get a taste of the simple life.

The Surry Shine Club will meet on Thursday, June 1st, 2023, at 6 pm. A meal will be provided at 6:30 pm. The cost of meals is \$10 per person. The address for this club is 1029 West Lake Drive, Mount Airy, NC. President Keith Osborne requests that you RSVP to (336)452-2660 for food planning. Nobles and Ladies are invited to attend this event.

On Friday, June 2nd, the Shriners On Bikes (SOBS) plan a motorcycle ride through the community. Oasis is planning a golf outing at 1 pm. We are planning a golf outing. The hospitality room will open from 2 pm to 4 pm at the Hampton Inn. We will take our party to Jeff "Frog" Puckett's farm in the evening. The address to this event is 1714 Maple Church Rd., Mt. Airy, NC. The event is located approximately 10 minutes from the local hotels. We have rented a large tent for seating and commercial size, air-conditioned toilets.

The farm has a fishpond, and a nearby local creek is stocked with trout if you are interested in fishing. You will need a fishing license if you fish in the local stream. Bring your pole and bait, and spend the day on the farm. The Mini Truckers will cook 16 Boston Butts, trimmings, and homemade desserts on Friday for our evening meal. Our host hotel, Hampton Inn, is currently booked. We originally reserved 69 rooms which were booked very quickly. The ceremony will begin at 9 am on Saturday, June 3rd, 2023, at the Mayberry Playhouse. The doors will open at 6 am for anyone who needs to set up. Parking is at the side of the building, and Oasis will shuttle members from the local hotels. If you know anyone interested in selling items at the Shrine Mart, don't hesitate to get in touch with Noble Keith Osborne at (336)452-2660. Noble Keith is the chairman of the Shrine Mart this year. Set up time will be from 6 am to 7 am. The Shrine Mart will be open from 7 am to 1 pm. We will have tables in Mount Airy available for you to place your merchandise.

Lady Sherrie Vandergriff and the Provost Guard will assist new candidates with registration beginning at 7 am. We will register each new candidate until 8:30 am. The Oasis Divan will meet at 8:40 am to vote on the new candidates.

The ceremony will begin at 9 am and end at 11:30 am. Please encourage new candidates to bring their wives or girlfriend to all events. The ladies are invited to attend the first part of our ceremony. We always welcome our ladies to witness the creation of a Shriner. It is a special moment when the Directors' Staff creates a new Shriner before our eyes. The ladies will be dismissed at 9:45 am to attend a ladies' brunch. The brunch will be held across the street at the Surry Arts Council Building at 10 am. Lady Leah invites all ladies to attend this special event. Our ladies will be the first public group to utilize this new facility. Ladies who plan to attend should register before May 30th, 2023, to ensure we order the correct number of meals. Silvia's Honey Tree will cater the lady's brunch. The parade lineup will begin at 1 pm in a large parking lot at Independence Blvd and Willow Street. After the parade, the Hospitality room will be open at the Hampton Inn from 3 pm until 5 pm.

My topic this month will be co-mingling of hospital monies and club/unit monies, or more specifically **why this**

should never be done.

As everyone knows, we continually have fundraisers for both hospital projects and club/ unit/temple projects. The monies from the hospital projects help offset the tremendous cost of owning and operating 22 hospitals in these times of higher and higher medical costs. Possibly even more important is the volunteer work our Shriner family provides for these hospitals, but this is another topic for another day. Today we are discussing money. As I began above, money raised for hospitals needs are one category, money raised to support the operations of our clubs/units and

Oasis Headquarters is the other category. Just remember the phase **"never the twain shall meet,"** meaning "two things which are so different as to have no opportunity to unite."

O.K. you may be asking, where is he going with this since I'm getting bored. Let me use an example for the sake of simplicity. Say a club/ unit has a very successful hospital fundraising project and would like to celebrate by having a dinner for the club/unit members. None of the funds raised from the hospital project can be used to pay for the dinner. These monies would need to come from the club/unit having had a "fraternal" (non-hospital) type fundraiser, from member donations, or from club/unit savings. It's a good idea to have at least one club/unit fraternal fundraiser per year so that members' dues do not have to be increased to handle ongoing club/unit operating expenses. Likewise, and very important, clubs/units should have separate bank accounts for their hospital versus fraternal fundraising. The account used for hospital fundraising should be associated with tax EIN for Oasis or that club/unit.

There are a couple of key drivers for this rule; first one being the IRS severely frowns upon any co-mingling of funds, meaning they could revoke our 501c3 status, whereby we would be required to pay property taxes on our holdings, donor dollars would cease...little things like that. But the second and most important reason why we would never want to co-mingle these funds, is that we would never want to betray the trust of our donors by using any hospital monies for fraternal purposes.

Oasis Shriners Potentate's Lineage

Greetings again from the Oasis Historical Preservation Society. This month we will showcase the Potentate's lineage of Past Potentate IS Bill Carter. William Henry Carter currently lives in Blowing Rock and is the Owner/Broker-in-Charge of The Carter Land Company. IS Bill currently serves as the fifth vice president of the South Atlantic Shrine Association. His lineage begins with IS Arthur J. Crampton, who was first elected to the Divan in 1907 as Oriental Guide and served as Potentate in 1911. He made three appointments to the moving line, two of which became Potentate. IS Arthur J. Crampton fathered five current Oasis lines, four of them include IS Dr. Richard Jordan Noble, who also served as Grand Master of Masons in NC in 1889. The other included IS Dr. Clyde E. Cotton, who is in the IS Tommy Helms lineage. The following table lists the IS Bill Carter line in its entirety.

IS Lee Folger was Oasis Potentate in 1929. He was appointed to the moving line in 1925 by IS Louis D. Sutherland to replace Eugene B. Graham, who had to resign from the Divan due to health issues. On October 1, 1937, IS Folger founded the company that would later become Folger Buick and was awarded an exclusive Buick franchise for the city of Charlotte. IS Folger made two appointments to the moving line, Noble Claude Allen Cochran and Noble Roy Frances Ebbs.

This lineage has the distinction of producing some Potentates who hail from the farthest reaches of Western North Carolina.

IS Roy F. Ebbs of Asheville was elected to serve as Grand Master of Masons of North Carolina in 1934.

IS Dr. Maxwell E. Hoffman was a practicing dentist from Dallas who served as Grand Master of Masons of North Carolina in 1948.

IS John Y. Jordan, Jr. was born in 1896, and at the young age of 22 served as the American vice-consul to Brest, France according to a 1918 Asheville Citizen-Times article. He was in line to receive the peace party as the First World War had just concluded that same year, and young Jordan had just concluded his first year of studying law at the University of North Carolina. In the 1950s, he served as one of Buncombe County's representatives in the NC General Assembly.

IS W. Fleming Talman operated Talman's Office Supply in Asheville and served on the NC ABC Commission.

IS Robert I. Presley of Asheville was appointed by the governor to serve on the NC National Parks, Parkway, and Forests Development Commission. He was also elected in 1953 to serve as president of the NC Bottlers Association.

IS William D. Whitaker, a native and lifelong resident of Cherokee County, is buried in Andrews and served in the 81st "Wildcat" Infantry Division during the First World War which began in 1914 when he was 19 years old. He later served as both secretary and president of the Wildcat Division Association several times during his life as indicated on his military grave marker.

IS Charles O. Van Gorder II served as a Major in the United States Army during the Second World War. He received the Bronze Star Medal and Purple Heart with an oak leaf cluster. As a physician, he participated in D-Day as a 31 year old Captain in the Army Medical Corps. Dr. Van Gorder set up a MASH-like medical facility in the middle of battle. He was taken as a Prisoner of War on December 19, 1944, his 32nd birthday, and later escaped from German Prisoner of War Camp in Poland having reached the American lines near Bastogne by the spring of 1945. The story of his service was featured in Tom Brokaw's "The Greatest Generation." In 1966, he joined with two fellow soldiers and physicians from the Second World War to establish the Valley River Clinic in Andrews in Cherokee County. Dr. Van Gorder practiced medicine in Andrews and at District Memorial Hospital and helped form the backbone of providing medical treatment to the citizens of Western North Carolina counties. On October 6, 2005, the NC Department of Transportation dedicated a bridge on U.S. 19-74-129 in the vicinity of Andrews to honor his dedication and service to the citizens of his community, state and nation.

IS Tommy Arakas began his long career in the restaurant business beginning with Plaza Café in Biltmore Village from his father, then later co-owning and operating Wink's Drive-in on Tunnel Road. Following Winks, he operated Rak's Airport Restaurant for more than two decades, and after his retirement, he operated Rak's Downtown Café. While continuing to operate his restaurant, he and his longtime friends, the Zourzoukis brothers, founded Asheville Catering Service.

IS Gene Shope was born in Asheville and spent his entire life in the Buncombe County area. He founded Arden Equipment Company and was president for 35 years. He served on the J.I. Case Company Dealer Council Engineering Committee, was a member of the Board of Directors of the Carolina Dealer of Equipment Association.

IS Rolla Rogers was a self-employed business owner in Henderson County for 42 years and served with distinction on the Greenville Shriners Hospital Board of Governors until he was honored as an Emeritus Member. He served as state president of the Ohio Jaycees.

IS W. David Sumpter, III and Lady Sandra reside in Murphy where III. Sir David has maintained his law practice for many years. He is a proud Vietnam Veteran having served in the United States Air Force. He served the NC State Bar as a counselor and served as Chairman of Cherokee County Board of Commissioners as well as Chairman of the Cherokee County Board of Elections. In 2011, while serving Oasis as High Priest & Prophet, he was awarded the Citizen Lawyer Award by the NC Bar Association. The Citizen Lawyer Award was established to recognize and thank lawyers who, in addition to their legal work, exemplify the ideals of a citizen lawyer by volunteering their time for worthy community or civic causes to improve the quality of life of those in their local or statewide communities. He is a Past Master of Cherokee Lodge, Past President of the Western North Carolina Shrine Club, and Past President of the Murphy Rotary Club.

We would like to thank all the Nobles who have mentioned to us how much they are enjoying this series of articles. It is our honor and pleasure to research and present this Oasis history to you, as a learning tool and hopefully a means to keep it preserved for our current and future Nobles.






