I was so proud to represent Oasis parade units at the SASA Banquet. Oasis units received many awards at this event. Divan members were honored to celebrate your achievements as we presented the awards to you at the Saturday evening celebration. DJ Chad Sain provided the music, we had food, and we celebrated by raising \$2,500 for the Shriners Children's and \$1,500 for the bicycle give away at our circus. We had so much fun, and there is a rumor that Oasis members were evicted from a pool. I can neither confirm, nor deny that allegation. I can say that we all enjoyed a great time as an Oasis family.

It has been a busy time for our Divan and support staff this fall. We have visited several clubs and units. Membership has been and is still my number one goal for 2023. The membership team has not only been working hard to encourage new nobles, but they have also been calling nobles who have not paid their dues for 2023. I am asking each of you to please confirm that you have paid your dues for 2023. If you have received a call or message from one of our membership team members, you may have missed paying your dues. If you are a noble who may be having financial issues that affect your ability to maintain your current dues, please email support@oasisshriners.org, membership@oasisshriners.org or call one of the support staff members at Oasis Shrine Center. You have worked too hard to become an Oasis noble. Your divan members are here to assist you. We are Shrine Masons and we do not want to lose you as a member. Please email or call us today to see how we may be able to help you with your membership dues. If you are an Oasis member who has 130 years combined, (age + years as a Noble) and facing financial difficulty, please contact Oasis support staff. We can help reduce your membership dues. No matter what your age or health condition. Oasis does not want to lose you as a member. We are one big family, and we will work together to find solutions. My goal at the beginning of 2023 was "plus 100." This goal meant that we would work hard together in 2023 to gain 100 Oasis nobles. If we can do this for ten years, we would increase our membership by 1.000. I admit this goal is a challenge. However, we are working to gain 200 new Nobles in 2023. I need each you to help me with the goal by paying your 2023 and 2024 dues. We cannot control the Black Camel, but we can encourage Master Masons to join, and we can continue to pay our dues today.

Many nobles have asked questions about the recent dues increase. I would like to take a moment to ensure that everyone understands the breakdown of your dues. Your dues for 2024 increased by \$20. This was not an Oasis increase but a Shriners International increase. This increase was voted at the July Imperial Session in Charlotte. Oasis currently receives \$47 per noble; Shriners Children's receives \$5 per noble, Shriners International receives \$50 per noble for a total of \$102. Your Oasis Divan has worked very hard to maintain our dues at \$47. If you have attended any Oasis sponsored event this year, I know that you have received a value of more than \$47. Oasis is blessed to rent our Shrine Center which provides for additional funds. Oasis also benefits from our Shrine Circus and annual Golf Tournament. These events provide income which helps keep your membership dues at the current rate. We all know the price of everything has increased significantly. This is why it is so important that we continue to work to increase our membership. Many years ago, we had more than 15,000 Oasis members. We are now around 3,700 nobles. We can increase our membership, and this is why it is important that we all grow together. Our Shrine patients and families depend on us for their medical needs.

Another way we can increase membership is to promote more family-fun events for our members to enjoy. Noble Jack Wallace and the Oasis Clown Unit just completed our Shrine Circus events for 2023. Many clubs, units, and nobles donated money and time to help continue the Rodney Morgan Bicycle Giveaway. At least 115 bicycles and helmets were purchased, assembled, and given to kids who attended the Shrine Circus events in Greensboro and Concord. What better way to have fun than to sponsor a circus and give away bicycles to the kids who attend. Once again, the circus was a fun success! Thank you, Noble Jack Wallace, Oasis Clown Unit, and the many volunteers who participated in these events.

Oasis parade units enjoyed a great time as we paraded in Oxford, NC while celebrating the 150th birthday for our Masonic Home for Children. The kids had a great time, and it was so much fun seeing so many of our Masonic families and friends at this event. Oasis made a \$5,000 donation to our Masonic Home during this weekend. We, as Shrine Masons, work hard to support our children. Your divan members felt the donation would benefit the future of our kids in Oxford, NC. You also have an opportunity to donate to support these kids. I am told that if every Mason in the state of North Carolins would give \$10 each month to our Masonic Home for Children, the home would not need additional donations to take care of these kids. I hope each of the clubs and units have held your election of officers for 2024. Please ensure your elected officers have paid their dues for 2024. Hello nobles, ladies, and friends of the Shrine. My message this month will focus on the current state of our Shriners Children's health care system.

The following information in from Shriners Children's online website: At Shriners Children's, we are committed to reaching as many children as possible, wherever they may live, and offering them our unique, patient-centered, wrap-around care.

For most of its history, our health care system has been known as Shriners Hospitals for Children. As we adapt to current nationwide trends in health care, especially the emphasis on outpatient care, and as some locations become clinics or outpatient centers, we have introduced the phrase "Shriners Children's." It is shorter and more definitive — clearly stating who we are and what we care about. We are Shriners and our commitment is to Children. In today's fast-paced world, this short phrase helps to succinctly and clearly define us.

Since opening our first hospital in 1922, we have been devoted to providing high-quality specialty medical care to the children and families who come to us, regardless of their ability to pay or insurance status. A century later, our commitment hasn't changed — only expanded.

Our three-part mission has one goal: to change and improve lives. We do this by caring for our patients, conducting research to gain knowledge and develop new treatments, and providing educational opportunities for physicians and other healthcare professionals.

From One Location to Worldwide Reach

The members of the Shriners fraternity have always shared a desire to help those in need. In the late 1910s, as a polio epidemic swept across the United States, it was apparent that many children were going without appropriate care. So the Shriners established a children's hospital to meet this need.

On May 12, 1922, thousands gathered to witness the placing of the cornerstone of the first Shriners Children's hospital, in Shreveport, Louisiana. The first patient – a little girl with clubfoot – was seen on Sept. 16, 1922, in a remodeled home adjacent to the Masonic temple while construction of the permanent hospital was underway.

What began as a single hospital is now a worldrenowned and beloved healthcare system with hospitals, outpatient clinics, ambulatory care centers and outreach locations across the globe. We are now providing hope and healing to more children in more places.

Hope and Healing

Today, Shriners Children's offers care for a range of orthopedic issues, as well as care for burn injuries, craniofacial conditions, spine care and spinal cord injuries, colorectal and gastrointestinal care, and sports medicine. Our experienced, innovative and dedicated teams work together to provide treatment to help each patient meet their goals and reach their full potential.

At Shriners Children's, we are grateful for the vision of the Shriners that led to the creation of our healthcare system. We look forward to a second hundred years of changing and improving the lives of children.





Oasis Desert Dust "GO GREEN" Campaign is Underway!



Spotlight on The Oasis Oriental Band

The first 75 years

The Oasis Oriental Band is currently celebrating its 75th anniversary with great joy throughout 2023. Since its establishment in January 1948, the band has had a rich and lengthy history. Beginning with the leadership of the famous Charlie B. Robinson, who used to march ahead of the band in full attire, high-stepping and swinging his iconic sword. According to The State Magazine dated September 17, 1949, Charlie Robinson exclaimed, "There is not a musician in the crowd." In 1949, the band traveled to Norfolk, VA, to compete against Oriental Shrine Bands from 17 other cities and won first place. The founding members of the band worked diligently to learn the music, march, and contribute funds to combat the dreadful polio epidemic in Greensboro, NC.

I have heard numerous stories from veteran band members concerning their prime years. During those days, new recruits had to be Noble Shriners aged 40 years or younger. Moreover, the band restricted the number of members allowed to participate in a parade to 40, and those spots had to be earned. If a member missed practice or a parade, they were removed from the lineup and had to wait for another opportunity to arise.

Over the past 75 years, many things have changed, including the fact that the band no longer marches in parades while playing but instead rides on a float. There are also no longer age restrictions on joining, and our oldest active member, Noble Ray Anderson, celebrated his 95th Birthday last week. While much has changed, many things have remained unchanged, except for associate member Noble John Elder P.P., who is a member of and plays tuba in The Oasis Band (Big Band), there is still not a musician in the crowd. The Oriental Band celebrated its 75th anniversary at SASA by having dinner as a group with wives present and were very excited to win first place in the Oriental Band Riding Category.

Noble Chip Burch, Past Captain of The Oriental Band, often says, "The oriental band makes a Joyful Noise." The band is currently led by Joe Deich and Captain Doug Gaines. They practice every Wednesday at 6:30 pm at the Greensboro Shrine Club, and if you are a noble who isn't a part of a unit, come make a joyful noise with the legendary Oasis Oriental Band-no musical experience is necessary.






