Hello Everyone,

I hope this note finds you well. My next few articles will focus on our hospital kids, and I

hope you enjoy reading their stories. This month's focus is on Noemi. The following information is readily available on Shriners Children's website, but I am more than happy to bring it to you personally.

For Noemi, More Range of Motion Means More Possibilities



If you ask 9-year-old Noemi which superpowers she would want most, she answers "teleportation" and "healing." It's not hard to imagine why.

Immediately after Noemi was born, the neonatal intensive care unit referred her and her mother Andrea to Shriners Children's™. They visited for the first time when Noemi was two weeks old, and she was diagnosed with arthrogryposis multiplex congenita.

This rare disorder causes stiff joints and abnormal muscle development. It can lead to a limited range of motion in wrists, hands, elbows, shoulders, hips, knees and ankles. Sometimes, the motion is so limited that the joint is fixed and there's no movement at all.

Arthrogryposis has no known cure, but because the physicians at Shriners Children's have treated thousands of children with this disorder, Andrea knew that her baby was in good hands.

Over the years Noemi has benefited from a range of treatments including casting, orthotics, and corrective surgeries. These interventions have changed the course of

her life. Without them, Noemi wouldn't be able to walk, but with them, her mobility and independence are flourishing.

Thanks to treatment, Noemi can complete many activities of daily life. P.E. is one of her favorite classes, and a special program at Shriners Children's has helped her realize another dream. Through BikeFit, Noemi was gifted and trained on an adaptive bike. Now she can experience the joy of peddling and cruising alongside her siblings and friends.

The loving community and family-friendly environment at Shriners Children's have also been a blessing to Andrea, who could tell from the beginning that "Everyone truly cares about the kids." She's watched and rejoiced as special supports like the activity center, gifts during stays, and time with therapy dogs have supported both her and Noemi in "healing and maintaining a positive focus."

To the generous donors who have made so much possible for Noemi, Andrea has clear message: "Your kindness will make all the difference to a child and [their] family who are struggling to give them their best life." Andrea would certainly know – thanks to the loving gifts of donors, Noemi has had every chance to thrive.

Things continue to go well here at Oasis, and we would love to have your stop by and visit your temple. Take care until next month, and remember, the work you do for our fraternity and philanthropy is sincerely *appreciated and essential* to our hospitals and all our Shriners' children like Noemi, that they serve.



INTRODUCING YOUR Second Ceremonial Master

Noble Tom Bridges began his journey in Hibriten Lodge 262 in Lenoir in 2010 when he was raised to the Sublime Degree of Master Mason and joined Oasis Shriners that same year. He served as Master in 2018 and Master of Knights of Solomon Lodge No. 764 in 2021. He is a member of Prometheus Lodge No. 775, a traditional observance lodge. Noble Tom proudly served the Grand Lodge of Ancient Free and Accepted Masons as District Deputy Grand Master of the 34th Masonic District from 2022-2024.

Noble Tom has extensive service within the York Rite of Freemasonry including service as the Most Excellent Grand High Priest of the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons in North Carolina during both 2019 and 2020. He received the Knight York Grand Cross of Honor in 2019. He currently serves with pleasure as the North Carolina Representative to the General Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons International.

Noble Tom served as Sovereign Master of J. Allen Suther Council No. 337, Allied Masonic Degrees in 2016 and served as Excellent Chief of Appalachian Council No. 121, Knight Masons in 2020. He served as Governor of the Western North Carolina York Rite Sovereign College No. 78 in 2023. Noble Tom served as President of the North Carolina Associated of Allied Masonic Degrees in 2019.

Noble Tom served as Master of the North Carolina Court No. 73, The Masonic Order of Athelstan in 2022. He is a long-serving treasurer of Solar White Quarry for The Operatives and serves as an officer of North Carolina Conclave No. 24, Pilgrim Preceptors, having also been a Charter Member of that body. He serves as an officer within the Grand Line for The Commemorative Order of St. Thomas of Acon, United States of America.

Noble Tom is serving as Sovereign of the St. Titus Conclave, Red Cross of Constantine this year. He serves within the progressive officer line for Mount of the Holy Cross Tabernacle No. 1, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests and stands to serve as its Preceptor in 2031.

He is an Associate Regent of the York Rite Sovereign College of North America, having been elected to receive the Order of the Purple Cross of York (OPC) in 2022, which is the highest honor of the College and is only conferred on members who have distinguished themselves by their service to humanity or to the Rite.

He is a member of the Grand College of Rites of the United States of America, the Sovereign Order of Knight Preceptors,


the Ancient and Masonic Order of the Scarlet Cord, the Royal Order of the Red Branch of Eri, the Royal Order of Scotland, Ye Ancient Order of Noble Corks, the Masonic Order of the Bath, and the Ancient and Heroic Order of the Gordian Knot. In 2022, he served as President of National Sojourners Chapter 553 and in 2023 served as Commander of the Heroes of '76, Cane Creek Camp. He is a member of the Advisory Council for Lenoir Assembly No. 87, The International Order of the Rainbow for Girls.

Within the Scottish Rite of Freemasonry, this distinguished brother is a member of the Valley of Charlotte, Orient of North Carolina in which he served as Wise Master of the Mecklenburg Chapter of Rose Croix in 2020 and 2021. He was distinguished as a Knight Commander of the Court of Honour and received his red cap in 2017. He is also a member of the Valley of Spartanburg, South Carolina.

Within the Shrine, Noble Tom served as President of Foothills Shrine Club in both 2014 and 2015 and is a proud member of the Oasis Patrol Unit. He is a member of the Royal Order of Jesters, Charlotte Court 109. He is also a member of the Order of Quetzalcoatl, Teocalli No. 99. He was appointed to the Oasis Divan in 2021 by Illustrious Sir Tommy Helms to serve as Outer Guard and Membership Chairman and was reappointed to that position in 2022 by Illustrious Sir Tim Daniels. He was appointed in 2023 by Illustrious Sir Doug Garland as Marshal and successfully implemented numerous Oasis Fundraisers including raffles as well as the annual Oasis Golf Tournament.

His son, Nick, is a proud Master Mason and Noble of Oasis Shriners. His daughter, Alana, is a Past Grand Worthy Advisor for the Grand Assembly of North Carolina, International Order of the Rainbow for Girls. His wife, Lady Shela, proudly served as Queen of Latona Temple No.154, Daughters of the Nile in both 2014 and 2018.

INTRODUCING YOUR Potentate

Illustrious Sir Chris was born and raised in Robbinsville, Graham County, in far western North Carolina where he graduated as Valedictorian. After attending Western Carolina University as a North Carolina Teaching Fellow, he began his career in education in Gaston County and has resided in Gaston County since that time. Noble Chris later received his Master's Degree from Appalachian State University and currently serves as a project manager in Gaston County Schools.

Illustrious Sir Chris was raised as a fourth generation Master Mason on January 15, 2005, in Robbinsville Lodge #672. He attended Wilkerson College in 2010 and received the Mason of the Year award in King Solomon Lodge #704 in 2010 and 2017. He served as a Director of the Gastonia Masonic Temple Association from 2010-2017. He served as an assistant tyler at Grand Lodge Annual Communication from 2009-2012.

Illustrious Sir Chris was elected and installed as both Master of King Solomon Lodge #704 in Gastonia and President of the Gaston County Shrine Club in 2013. He was presented a Lifetime Achievement Award from King Solomon #704 in 2018 and served as District Deputy Grand Master of the 36th Masonic District from 2017-19. He served on the Grand Lodge Masonic Renewal Committee, the Subordinate Lodge Special Activities Commission, and the Committee for the Masonic Home for Children at Oxford.

Illustrious Sir Chris joined the Scottish Rite in 2007 and received the Knight Commander Court of Honour (KCCCH) in 2011. He is a Past Venerable Master and Endowed Life Member of the Charlotte Scottish Rite. He is an emeritus member of the Knights of St. Andrew.

Illustrious Sir Chris received the Knight York Cross of Honour (KYCH) in the York Rite in 2014 and is a member of the Lenoir York Rite Bodies. Noble Chris is the current Governor of the York Rite Sovereign College, Western North Carolina College #78 and is a Past Excellent Chief of Knight Masons, Saint Patrick's Council #1. He is an officer in the Masonic Order of Athelstan, the Operatives, the Red Cross of Constantine, St. Thomas of Acon, Holy Royal Arch Knight Templar Priests, and other York Rite organizations. He is a Past Sovereign Master of the Allied Masonic Degrees, J. Allen Suther Council No. 337. Illustrious Sir Chris is a Past President of the North Carolina Association of Allied Masonic Degrees. He is a member of the Societas Rosicruciana in Civitatibus Foederatis (S.R.I.C.F.).

He served as the 2022-23 Most Excellent Grand High Priest of

the Grand Chapter of Royal Arch Masons of North Carolina and received his Knight York Grand Cross of Honour (KYGCH).

In 2024, he received the North Carolina Grand Council's Simmons Jones Baker award and the North Carolina Grand Commandery's Knight Commander of the Temple (KCT). Also, in 2024, he was elected by

the York Rite Sovereign College of North America to receive the Order of the Purple Cross (OPC) in 2025, the York Rite's most coveted Masonic honor.


He was created a Shriner in the Hickory class of 2007 and joined the Oasis Patrol Unit and Patrol Color Guard in 2008 where he served as Patrol Captain in 2016-17. He was offered the opportunity to serve as Oasis Membership Chairman by Ill. Sir Fred Laxton in August 2013 and served in that capacity through 2016. He received the Hillbilly Degree from Clan #13 in 2009 and the Tarheel Degree in 2010 as is a member of the Order of Quetzalcoatl, Teocalli No. 99.

That same month, he was presented with a Life Membership in Oasis Shriners and the Walt Disney Award by Illustrious Sir W. David Sumpter III. He was named as a Class Honoree at the Hamlet Ceremonial in 2014.

Illustrious Sir Chris was appointed by Imperial Sir Chris Smith to serve as Imperial Public Relations Director, Region 8 and served from 2016-18. He was appointed by Imperial Sir Gary Bergenske to serve as Regional Membership Director, Region 8 (South Atlantic) and served from 2017-2019.

On Saturday, January 5, 2019, he was joined by Lady Laura as they were announced as the Second Ceremonial Master appointment of Illustrious Sir Kenneth D. Jarrett and Lady Vickie. Illustrious Sir Chris will serve as the 130th Potentate of Oasis Shriners in 2025.

This year's wall included Shriners Children from 1944 thru 2024.




